BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Born in 1925, Elizabeth St. John Myer "Betsy" Dunn attended the Shady Hill School in Cambridge, Massachusetts, and the Winsor School, a private girl's school in Boston (1). In 1946, she received a BA in mathematics from Vassar College and in 1981, an MPA from Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government (1). Dunn worked at Harvard in various capacities at the Center for International Affairs, the Office of the President, the Medical School, the Radcliffe Institute, and the School of Education (1). Dunn became a political activist in the 1970s for women's rights and provided supporting analysis for the EEOC class action lawsuit filed on behalf of women against Tufts University (1). Dunn was actively involved in the Democratic

Party in Cambridge, the Massachusetts League of Women Voters, and served as Massachusetts Legislative Coordinator for the National Organization for Women (1). She is also known for coining the term "gender gap" to describe voting patterns between men and women and worked to ensure gender equality for insurance contracts during a thirty-five-year period (1). In 1973, Dunn established and organized a women's ice hockey team called the Ms. Sticks and Mother Puckers that played against other college-aged women from local universities (1).
